Note: A migrant butterfly from North Africa. None, at any stage of development, survive our winter. Both male and female are similar except that the female is larger. They start to arrive at the end of March and quickly spread through the UK to Iceland.

Butterfly:	Birds foot Trefoil (Lotus corniculatus), Bugle (Ajuga reptans), Carline Thistle (Carlina vulgaris), Hawkweeds (Hieracium/Hypochoeris), Heather (Calluna vulgaris/Erica spp), Ivy (Hedera helix), Knapweeds (Centaurea spp.), Privet ((Liqustrum vulgare), Ragwort(Seecio jacoaea) Red Clover (Trifolium patense), Thistles (Cirsium spp. And Carduus spp.)
Habitat:	Can be seen everywhere from the sea shore to mountain tops. A very strong flier.
